She then worked as a Senior musculoskeletal physiotherapist at St George's Hospital, London, before moving into an Advanced Physiotherapy Practitioner role in 2010, initially at Guy's and St Thomas' and now at Frimley. She completed her MSc in Advanced Neuromusculoskeletal Physiotherapy in 2013, and has presented her research, a systematic review of acupuncture treatment for shoulder pain, at the Physio UK conference 2017 as well as at the APPN study day in 2018.

Anna's APP role was initially in MSK assessment and triage, and now also involves clinics within Orthopaedics and Primary Care. She led on GP communication and education whilst at GSTT. She is team lead for the Farnham First Contact Practitioner service which she has helped to set up in Hampshire. She is closely involved in her Trust's ongoing development of the First Contact Practitioner role, and, in particular, training and development into these roles. She is an active member of the CSP FCP network group.

Anna also sits on the Frimley Health NHS Trust Clinical IT strategy board, where she represents the Trust's Allied Health Professionals in ensuring clinician-led decision making around implementation of technology and influencing provision of new and innovative systems.
